THE WORKSHOP

This workshop uses dream work and active imagination, body and voice work, mask and art to offer reflective space to explore the as yet 'unlived life', the potential to become who we are meant to be.

There we will awaken to our body's wisdom, listen to our dreams and give expression to this new energy in the creation of a mask. We will draw on the teachings of Marion Woodman and the BodySoul work in conjunction with Jungian and Gestalt theory.

WHO IS THE WORKSHOP FOR?

- ☀ Men and women who are engaged in their own personal work and want to inquire deeper.
- ☀ People who have worked with masks and want to explore more fully the relationship between mask work and dreams.
- ☀ People who are professionally engaged in working with the development of others and interested in learning about the process of 'active imagination' using dreams, art, body, voice and mask work.

Couples have benefitted enormously from attending this workshop together, however this is not an event for remedial work on relationships that are breaking down, but an opportunity for deepening your own self understanding in a shared space.



FEES

The fee for this workshop is **600 euros**, with accommodation extra (see below). A non-returnable deposit of **200** euros will secure your place on the programme. The full fee is due by 30th May 2012 after which the fee increases to 675 euros.

This is a popular workshop, we recommend early booking.

ACCOMMODATION www.skites.gr

Skites is a delightful villa set in its own grounds on the coast of Northern Greece. With private access to the sea and small beach, this venue offers a wonderful space for personal reflection and relaxation.

All rooms are en-suite, air conditioned and many with balconies and sea views. Prices below are for two people sharing and single rooms. The very reasonable cost of this venue includes breakfast. Lunch and dinner are extra, we have negotiated a special group rate for these meals during the workshop - see below.

Room costs range from **€80 - €100** per room per night for **two** people.

Single rooms are **€64 - €80** per night
Room rates include breakfast.

Light lunch and evening meal will be an extra **€20** per person per day commencing with dinner on the 2nd July and ending with lunch on the 7th July.

You will be required to book your accommodation yourself and pay a 50% deposit (refundable up to 21 days before the event). Extra stay either side of the workshop can also be booked at the same room rates. We will advise you on how to make your room reservations when you book the workshop - and to manage shared accommodation for those wishing to share with another participant.

You will pay for all your accommodation and extras directly to the venue on your departure.



THE PROGRAMME

The programme will start at 6 pm on the 2nd July, ending early afternoon on the 7th July.

You will be asked to bring a number of items such as journal and soft pastels. We will contact you nearer the time to provide you with full details of these requirements along with travel information from Thessaloniki to Skites.
